On Thursday evening, July 13, 2017, the annual meeting of the Springfield Historical Society will be held at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Meetinghouse, 23 Four Corners Rd, Springfield, NH. Election of Officers will take place followed by our evening program at 7:15. Our speaker will be Richard Hesse, Professor Emeritus at the UNH School of Law, and the topic will be "The Founding Fathers: What Were They Thinking?" Professor Hesse has published on a variety of legal and ethical topics. He served as a community lawyer in Philadelphia, heading a community relations project before moving to Boston to head a national project focused on the rights of consumers. His academic concentration is on state and federal constitutional law and international human rights. Hesse has been an advocate for civil and human rights for more than 50 years and was twice awarded the Bill of Rights Award by the NH Civil Liberties Union. Admission is free and open to the public.
